Once you have decided on your prompt, and you have pulled up a Google Doc, you need to cover your monitor with a sheet of paper. That is write....er, I mean right; you are going to type your story without looking at what you are typing.

This means you can't go back and change anything. So, think before you type.

When you have finished typing your story, call me over. You will then be able to uncover your monitor and submit your story to turnitin.com. Do not look at your monitor without me present. I don't want you to start changing things on impulse.
