## Point of View (P.O.V.)

 The vantage point from which the author presents a story

 Told through a narrator—the person who tells the story First-person: narrator is a character in the story. Content limited to what narrator knows. These stories *use I, me, our, we,* or *m*y.

Third-person: These stories use *he, she,* and *they*. narrator is not part of the story.

limited: only know what some characters are thinking omniscient: knows what everyone is thinking

#### Characterization

 The process of bringing a character (imaginary person) to life through description

Physical appearance and personality Speech, thoughts, feelings, actions, and desires Interactions with other characters Personal history or other background information

## Flashback

 An interruption in the narrative to show something that occurred in the past

## Foreshadowing

 Provides hints or clues early in the story that anticipate what is to come. Helps contribute to moodIncreases suspense

#### Irony

• The contrast between what seems to be and what really is.... Example from "Indian Education" by Sherman Alexie

• Example: your friend "Slim" is 5'7" tall and weighs 290 lbs. "The farm town high school I play for is nicknamed the "Indians," and I'm probably the only actual Indian to play for a team with such a mascot."
