

Building Your World: Your first step to a fantasy story

- Build your world and locations on three scales:
 - Large-scale (universe, world, or continent)
 - Mid-scale (a country, town, or region)
 - Small-scale (individual story locations—tavern, castle, cave, etc.)

• Draw a map, even if you are not a good artist. By doing so, it helps you discover what makes your world unique and intriguing

Use Real World Themes

- Standard, real-world, themes can be explored in inventive, diverse ways through a fantasy lens.
- What are current concerns about politics, culture, environment, technology, racism, etc.

• Is anything frustrating you at this moment? You can explore it through your story.

• Think of it as a form of therapy—just cheaper (relationships, aging, responsibilities, etc.)
