

When writing a picture book...

- Just like anything else in the world, you need a bit of a plan or a checklist before you sit down to write a picture book.
- The next slide will take you through such a checklist (I recommend using it to work on your picture book).

The Checklist

- 1. Maintain a simple, clear plot that is based on a single situation.
- 2. Tell the story from a child's perspective.
- 3. Rely on the text to tell your story—illustrations are there to enhance not to be the storyteller.
- 4. Jump right in! There is no time for long description and detail.

- 5. Make every word count. Get rid of words that aren't needed. Remember, hit the 500-1,000-word mark.
- 6. Use interesting language. Don't condescend by using simplistic language. Talk up to the reader—never down.
- 7. Offer hope to the reader even if the subject matter is sad.
