## What do I mean by the title?

For those who have taken Creative Writing I, you will recognise the terms you are about to see.

Whether you took Creative Writing I last semester or last year, I want to bring these terms back into the forefront of your brain.

These are all terms that you will be working with consciously or subconsciously all semester long.

### Plot

- This is what happens in a story
- Subplot—less important series of events within a main plot

- Parts of Plot:
  - Exposition—background info: establishes setting and introduces characters
  - Rising Action—main character faces problem, conflict grows more intense
  - Climax—moment when story reaches peak
  - Falling Action--explores the consequences of the climatic decision
  - Resolution-central problem is finally solved

## Conflict

- The struggle between two opposing forces
- ► Types of Conflict:
  - Person vs. Person
  - Person vs. Society
  - Person vs. Nature
  - Person vs. Self
  - Person vs. Fate

# Setting

 Setting is the time and place in which a literary work takes place  Setting tells you what the world is like by describing its appearance and atmosphere

### Protagonist

- The main character of a story
- NOT always a good guy

Stereotypically the "Hero"

## Antagonist

- Stereotypically the "Villain"
- Opposes the protagonist. NOT always the bad guy

## Point of View (P.O.V.)

- The vantage point from which the author presents a story
- First-person: narrator is a character in the story. Content limited to what narrator knows. These stories use *I*, *me*, *our*, *we*, or *my*.

- Told through a narrator—the person who tells the story
- Third-person: These stories use he, she, and they. narrator is not part of the story.
  - limited: only know what some characters are thinking
  - omniscient: knows what everyone is thinking

## Characterization

The process of bringing a character (imaginary person) to life through description

- Physical appearance and personality
- Speech, thoughts, feelings, actions, and desires
- Interactions with other characters
- Personal history or other background information
